Stratford Administration Recommendations for Quarter 3

Daily Health Screening:

Stay Home With These New Symptoms

- Stratford Schools will follow the DHS guidelines with components of CDC, DHS, DPI, WIAA & MCHD. We will continue to contact the MCHD for clarification.

Transportation

- Significantly reduced students per bus
- Additional routes added
- Students sit in family units
- Masks required on the bus
- Buses sanitized after each route

We encourage parents to transport students when possible to help reduce bus numbers

General School Day Routines

- Students can enter the building at 7:40 am
- Students report directly to class
- Students should bring a water bottle
- Lockers only for high school, Grades 6-8 will keep backpack in the classroom
- No parents/visitors allowed in the building unless approved by administration.

Cohort Model: Elementary & Middle

- Students will remain with same small group throughout the day, as much as possible
- Middle school students will change classrooms as proposed at the January Board meeting
- Accelerated math students will be allowed in the classroom if students can maintain 6 foot social distance
- Middle School Art will be held in the elementary building with escorted transition
- 5th Grade Band lessons will begin in the MS/HS building with escorted transition

Recess

- Students will wash hands before and after recess
- Recess will be scheduled and cohorts will remain in affect on equipment
- Middle school students will be encouraged to go outside for recess during lunch

Sports/Activities

- Athletics will follow Marawood Conference guidelines for events
- Transportation - coaches should consider only one on the bus and others driving
- Siblings should sit together on the bus, athletes are encouraged to ride home with parents
- Middle School Club sports can practice and play games with a limit of 3 teams/tournaments
- There will be no changes to the guidelines for winter sports. Sport guidelines will be revisited before the spring season
- Music concerts to be determined

Health & Hygiene

- Additional hand sanitizing stations
- Air purification system installed in HVAC
- Nightly cleaning and weekly sanitation
- Safety & COVID awareness signage
- Physical distancing throughout buildings
- Water fill stations available

Mask Use

Stratford Schools will follow State & County orders and in addition will follow:

- District Buildings - masks are required for all K-12 students, all staff and visitors.
- Temporary removal for educational presentations must be 6 feet away (Teachers & Coaches)
- Mask breaks will continue

Lunch Procedure

- Students clean hands prior to eating
- Students attend lunch in waves
- Students eat in their cohort groups (preK-8)
- Touchless checkout systems
- Microwaves will be allowed (6-12)
- Physical distancing maintained (6-12)

Students With Symptoms of COVID

- Student isolated in isolation room
- Student wears disposable surgical mask
- Student cannot ride the bus home
- Parent/guardian picks up student within 30 mins

Blended Model: High School

- Students attend in-person 4 days a week
Mon, Tues, Thurs & Fri
- Student attend virtually on Wednesday
- Administration may require students to attend all days if at risk of failing
- Students may make appt to meet with an instructor on Wednesday
- Grades 6-12 will continue the block schedule for the remainder of the school year

Virtual Learning

- No new virtual students will be accepted into the 100% virtual program without an exemption from an approved medical provider
- We will encourage our 100% virtual students to come back to in-person learning
- Any current virtual students not meeting proficiency standards will be required to come back to in-person learning unless they have a medical exemption
- Appeals regarding virtual learning should be made to the District Administrator
- Virtual option for education will remain in effect for the remainder of the 2020-21 school year

Administration has the right to go back to stricter guidelines if there is a significant spike in COVID cases.
